Pray...

Slow down and take just a few minutes this morning and pray. Offer prayers of thanksgiving. Offer prayers of praise for who God is. Invite to Holy Spirit to open your heart to see more in the Scripture we read together.

Read...*(Let's look continue our journey in the Book of Acts!)*

Acts 3:1-28

Think...

What stands out to you about this historical moment recorded for us by Luke? Is it the healing or the message preached by Peter and John that captures your heart this morning?

When it comes to the miracle in this moment what is most surprising about the response of the man healed?

What is unique about how Peter and John leverage this moment when people are paying attention? Have you ever had a moment where you could tell people about Jesus because they were open?

What is the explanation of the miracle? Why did God choose to heal this man? What kinds of things do you think God is doing now in these days to help people pay attention to Him?

What do Peter and John invite the people to do in response? (We call this invitation the Gospel, or the Good News) Take time to process the simplicity and grace of the Gospel.

Why do you think it's hard for us to be this bold when it comes to telling our friends about our faith in Jesus?

As we merge these churches and we step courageously toward our neighborhood and our city how can we as a church be both loving and bold about our faith in Jesus?

Pray...

Take some time to pray for our church as we merge 2 into one. Pray God will provide funds for our remodel. Pray God will unite people quickly. Pray God will bring new people to our spiritual family.

Take some time to pray for people you know who need Jesus. Pray that God will give you a chance to invest in them and invite them to follow Jesus.
