I. Introduction: The Significance of the Church

- **Ordinary People, Extraordinary Purpose:** The church began with "twelve very ordinary men" and continues today as a global movement.
- **Visibility of the Kingdom:** The church is the visible, tangible expression of God's kingdom on earth.

V. Living as the Church (Acts 2:42-47)

- **Core Practices:** The early church was devoted to the apostles' teaching, fellowship, the breaking of bread (the Lord's Supper), and prayer.
- **Radical Community:** Their life was characterized by signs and wonders, generous sharing of property and possessions, and daily gatherings.
- **Infectious Joy:** Because of their generosity and unity, they enjoyed the favor of all people, and the Lord added to their number daily.
